# **Primary Divisions**

P Primary Theme
T Transitional Theme
S Secondary Theme
K Closing Theme

## **Less Definite or Optional Divisions**

O Introductory material

N New material occurring after the exposition

Q Questionable functions, too ambiguous to justify a more precise symbol

## **Qualifying Identifiers**

a, b, c, etc. Phrases or smaller-dimension functions (i.e., 1Pb is the second phrase of 1P)

x, y, z, etc. Following a,b,c, etc., indicate motivic levels (i.e., 1Pby indicates second phrase of 1P,

using motive y.)

1P, 2S, etc. An arabic numeral *before* a primary division define constituent themes (i.e., 1P, 2P,

etc.)

P<sup>1</sup>, T<sup>2</sup> A raised superscript indicates variants (i.e., 1P might be followed by 1P<sup>1</sup>

P<sup>k</sup> Superscript 'k' means that a closing function is present at the end of the main function

 $(i.e., 2S^k)$ 

S(P) A division in parentheses indicates derivation (i.e., S (1P) indicates that S is derived

from 1P.)

> Further derivation, used within parentheses (i.e., K(2S > 1P)) indicates that K is

derived from 2S, which was in turn derived from 1P).

Isolates the rhythmic element of a theme (i.e., 1Sa(1Pr)) indicates that the first phrase

of 1S is derived from the rhythm of 1P.)

h Isolates the harmonic element of a theme (i.e., 1Sa(1Ph)) indicates that the first phrase

of 1S is derived from the harmony of 1P.)

A slash preceding any symbol indicates a location in the lower part of the texture:

1S/Pr refers to a secondary theme with lower parts based on the rhythm of a primary

theme.

#### **Phrases and Phrase Lengths**

2 + 2 Indicates two phrases of 2 measures each

4 x 2 Indicates two repetitions of a four-measure unit: read as 4 measures times 2.

#### **Examples**

1Pax First Phrase of First Primary Theme, employing motive 'x'

2T(2Pb) Second Transitional Theme, derived from the second phrase of Second Primary theme.  $2S^k(1Pr)$  Second Secondary Theme, with a closing function, derived from the rhythm of the First

Primary Theme.

2P<sup>1</sup> First variant of Second Primary Theme
